SCHOLARSHIPS: Here's what you need to know



If you live in a PHA neighborhood or building, or your family has a housing voucher with PHA, you may be eligible for these scholarships to help pay for college or training programs.

Thomas Valleau Scholarship (Formerly know as the PHA Scholarship)

- Applications are due May 15th each year. Awards up to \$5,000.
 - Just for Portland Housing residents and voucher participants **of any age**, so you have a good chance to get a scholarship.
 - Paid directly to the student so it doesn't effect financial aid.
 - Application, Essay, transcripts, recommendations, and financial information are required to apply.

NERC/NAHRO Allan R. Andrews Scholarship

- Applications are due May 5th, 2025.
- You must send your complete application to PHA at least 2 weeks before the listed due date to be considered.
 - Application must be signed by the Executive Director of PHA and have a letter of recommendation from him. PHA can only send 5 applications.
- No scholarship will be less than \$1,000.
 - New England based, open to any age or degree level.
 - Paid directly to the student so it doesn't effect financial aid.
 - Similar to the PHA scholarship in information needed to apply.

NAHRO National Merit Scholarship & LDG Scholars Program

- You must apply for and receive the NERC/NAHRO Allen R. Andrews Scholarship and be chosen by NERC to be considered for the NAHRO Merit Scholarship or LDG Scholars Program.
- Individual applications are not accepted.



Housing Authority Insurance Group Resident Scholarship

- Applications are due Friday May 30th, 2025. Twenty \$6,000 scholarships will be awarded.
 - Very simple application. National program so a lot of people apply. Winners chosen at random.

Maine Association of Public Housing Directors Scholarship

- Applications are typically due in April when available. Number and amount of awards depends on funding.

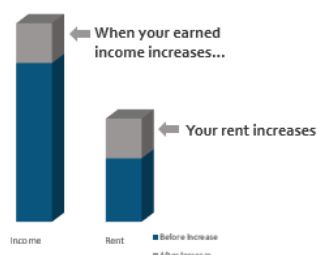
Thrive Together: Join the Family Self-Sufficiency Revolution!!

The Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) program is designed to help families become more independent by giving them the tools and support they need to reach their goals. It helps people get better jobs, finish their education, and save money for important things like buying A house or starting a business.

How the FSS Savings Account Works

When you receive federal housing assistance, your rent is based on your income.

That means:



When you enroll in the FSS program...



Families who join the program work with a coordinator who helps them set goals. These goals might include things like getting a high school diploma, learning new job skills, or improving their credit. As they work toward these goals, the program helps them by providing advice, training, and sometimes even scholarships.

One important part of the FSS program is that as families start earning more money, part of their rent is put into a special savings account called an escrow account. This “escrow” money grows over time and can be used for big things, like buying a home, when they graduate from the program. In short, the FSS program is about helping families get the skills, support, and savings they need to become self-sufficient and create better lives for themselves.

Learning Without Limits: FSS Participant in Progress!

Mohamud arrived in the United States from Somalia as a refugee in 2014, speaking very little English. He moved into the Public Housing Authority (PHA) and began working hard to build a better life for himself and his family. In 2019, he joined the Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) Program. Since then, Mohamud has made significant progress. He earned his Commercial Driver's License (CDL), graduated high school, and completed ESOL courses, becoming fully proficient in English. Education has been an important tool for change in his life, and he's modeled the importance of it for his children, one of whom was awarded a PHA scholarship and both of whom are now full-time college students.

When asked how the FSS Program has helped, Mohamud said, "FSS staff gives good advice, and the escrow helps me save money." He appreciates the guidance and financial support the program provides. He encourages others to join the program, saying, "I would tell people to come to Housing and talk to Feza."

Mohamud's story is one of hard work, determination, and the support that has helped him, and his family thrive. We're so proud of him! Keep going, Mohamed!

There's still time to get your taxes done for free through the CA\$H program, and you have options. Which one is right for you?

Option 1: In-Person Appointment: Please plan ahead, as appointments typically last 1 to 1.5 hours. Schedule your appointment at UWSM's Portland office by visiting uwsme.org/tax-appointment or by calling **207-347-2335**.

Option 2: Fully Virtual Service: Start the process online by visiting getyourrefund.org/gpmaine

Option 3: File your taxes yourself at myfreetaxes.com with access to a helpline for support.



Option 4: Starting January 27, simply visit a Scan & Go site, pick up an intake packet, return to have your documents scanned, and get assistance from our team to complete your filing.

You can find Scan & Go locations at cPort Credit Unions in Portland (Middle St., Forest Ave, and Riverside locations) and Scarborough (Route 1), as well as the **Portland Housing Authority Sagamore Village Study Center (21 Popham St., Right side of the Community Building on Wednesdays from 9-12 and 1-3:30).**



Curious About **College?** Need assistance with **paying for school?**

Maine Educational Opportunity Center (MEOC) can help!

MEOC is a federal TRIO program focused on college access and funding issues. TRIO programs support students who face barriers to college attendance and may even be the first generation of their family to go to college. Since 1991, MEOC has helped over 19,000 Maine residents enroll in higher education.

MEOC services are **100% free** and tailored to a student's individual needs and interests. It doesn't matter what college or undergraduate degree program you are interested in; MEOC is here to help! Typical supports include:

- **completion of college applications,**
- **FAFSA filing,**
- **scholarship searching, and**
- **default loan resolution**

while also providing referrals to other community based resources that may be of help. If a student has questions, concerns, or barriers related to the college access and financing process, MEOC is committed to assist!

Due to federal funding requirements, to be eligible for MEOC services, students must be financial aid eligible and not yet hold the equivalent of a US Bachelor's Degree.

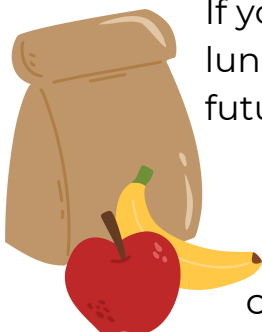

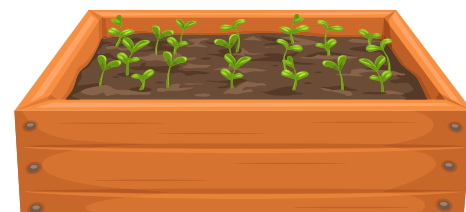


Seed & Seedling Distributions

Changes Coming to Riverton Park – What You Need to Know

Dear Riverton Park Residents,

As you know, Riverton Park is being renovated! The Portland Housing Authority (PHA) is working to make your homes better, and we want to keep you updated. We know change can be confusing, so here's what you need to know.

Riverton Park is getting important upgrades to fix up homes so they are safer and more comfortable for everyone.

How Will This Affect You?

- **You Will Not Lose Your Home:** No one has to move away forever. Some people may need to move for a little while, but PHA will help find a temporary home.
- **Rent Stays Affordable:** Your rent will still be based on how much money you make.
- **New Leases:** Everyone will get a new lease, but your rights as a tenant will stay the same.
- **Better Homes:** Expect new floors, better heating and cooling, and nicer common areas.

What's the Plan?

We are planning the changes carefully so that things go smoothly. Here's what will happen:

1. Meetings for Residents – We will have meetings to explain everything and answer questions.
2. Checking Apartments – Workers will look at homes to see what needs fixing.
3. Temporary Moves – To fix unit, you will temporarily relocate, but don't worry, we will help you find a temporary home.
4. Moving Back In – Once everything is ready, you will return to an updated home.

Your Rights and Responsibilities

- When you need to move temporarily, we will tell you ahead of time.
- Keep following your lease and PHA rules and paying rent on time.
- Come to meetings and stay informed about what's happening.

How to Stay Updated

- Attend Meetings – Come and learn what's happening.
- Read Notices – Look for letters and signs with important information.
- Check The Riverton Park Renovation Website – www.rivertonparkmaine.com/home
- Call Us – If you have questions, visit the Riverton Park office or Study Center
